Principles	We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils.
	We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
	In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged
	We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
	Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time
Provision	Providing small group work with an experienced teacher focused on overcoming gaps in learning
	All our work through the pupil premium was aimed at accelerating progress-moving children to at least age related expectations. Initially this was in Literacy and Numeracy
	Pupil premium resources used to target able children on FSM to achieve L3 at the end of KS1 or L5/6 at the end of KS2

Impact	<p>End of KS2-9 pupils were in receipt of FSM at some point during Y6 -all made at least 2 levels progress in Reading and maths, all attained L4+ in Reading and Maths, 8/9 pupils attained L4+ in Writing. 4/9 attained L5 in Reading. 100% of pupils in receipt of FSM achieved L4 in both English and Maths at the end of KS2 2012.</p>
	<p>FS2-8% of the cohort were eligible for FSM. This group attained at least 6 points in all areas of learning. 6 points is the national age-related expectation.</p>
	<p>Y1 phonics-8 FSM pupils-5/8 achieved the expected standard.</p>
	<p>Y2- FSM-5/9 at 2c+ in Reading and Writing, 8/9 at 2c+ for Maths.</p>
