Principles	We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils.
	We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
	In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged
	We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
	Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time
	Providing small group work with an experienced teacher focused on overcoming gaps in learning.
Provision	All our work through the pupil premium was aimed at accelerating progress-moving children to at least age related expectations. Initially this was in Literacy and Numeracy.

Impact	Y1 phonics - Pupil Premium spent on intervention for Phonics Screening Check contributed to resulted in 71% of disadvantaged children achieving phonics standard compared to 63% nationally.
	End of KS2- Attainment: 100% of pupils eligible for FSM who received intervention achieved at least a level 4 in Reading. Children from this group performed less well than their peers in Writing and Maths. Progress: The average progress made by children who received intervention was outstanding in Reading and good in Writing and Maths.
	Y2- Attainment for children eligible for FSM was slightly below their peers in Maths and Reading but was broadly in line for writing.
	Children receiving guitar tuition: Average points progress in Reading was 4.9, Writing 3.1 and Maths 4.1.
